Mr. Campbell graduated from Arkansas State University and served in the U.S. Army Signal Corps. His career, with Unisys Corporation, spanned over 30 years. During his career, he worked on contracts at the White Sands Missile Range, and several government agencies including NASA and Homeland Security. Survivors include his wife, Sara, of Montgomery, daughter Kelle Castleberry and her husband Dean of The Woodlands. He is also survived by two precious grandsons, Steven and Daniel Castleberry. Mr. Campbell was a member of the Conroe Church of Christ where he served as an elder. Mr. Campbell was very active in community service and enjoyed serving others in any way he could.
